





GRADY-WHITE FREEDOM 235

The Grady-White Freedom 235 mixes a smooth ride with loads of fishability.

Dual-console boats are one of the fastest growing runabout styles on the market. For starters, they capitalize on the new enthusiasm for outboard power and its easy maintenance. Second, dual consoles provide the cruising comforts of a bowrider but with the ruggedness and smooth ride of an offshore boat. Third, they incorporate the best of all possible fishing features to make them as fishable as they are fun. The Freedom 235 sets the bar high in this category, blending all three important characteristics in one finely designed boat.

For anglers, you have an optional livewell on the transom with Grady's signature plenum circulation system that eliminates pesky standpipes and improves circulation. There is also a large fish locker in the transom for keeping your catch fresh — or to keep your drinks cold. Gunwale rod holders provide plenty of tackle options for trolling or bottomfishing too. If you need to guide a big bruiser around the outboard, there is a wide, beefy transom door giving access to the port to starboard platform. The walkway is clear, with concealed lockers for stern lines and anchors.

That platform and its ladder will be especially appreciated when you pop up the optional tow pylon for pulling the skiers in your crew. The 235's deep-V hull can turn up some remarkable wakes.

Most impressive is how quickly the cockpit converts to comfortable cruising with the fold-down transom seat — open it in a second, stow it just as quickly. The port side of the cockpit features back-to-back seating ideal for watersports. Touch a button and the footrest slides out from the aft-facing seat, completing wraparound seating or a lounge for when you're cruising instead of fishing. The helm seat is a custom bucket with armrests, and the helm itself is designed with a coastal mariner in mind, leaving tons of space for electronics. Did I mention the generous head?


